# REPORT ON NSS ACTIVITIES

#### ➤ Hiroshima Day Peace Rally (5<sup>th</sup> August 2023)



#### > Choo-Macchar Volunteer Program (December 2023 to January 2024)



#### > Avhan Camp (25th December, 2023 to 3rd January, 2024)



# > Deployment of Super-efficient Appliances and Use of Solar Energy (31st January, 2024)


